



Greetings from Knock. I thought of you today when I visited the Shrine to Our Lady. There are lots of people like myself praying here for their family and friends. Knock is a very special place to many people. It's believed that over a hundred years ago Our Lady, St. Joseph and St. John appeared at the gable wall of the Roman Catholic Church. Even Pope John Paul II and Mother Teresa prayed at the Shrine when they were in Ireland.

During my visit I met people of all ages who had travelled from all over the world to pray at the Shrine in Knock. Even though there were a lot of people praying at the Shrine, it is still a very quiet and peaceful place. You see some people praying in groups as they walk around the Shrine. Others sit in the Church praying or listening to hymns. At certain times during the day the people who are sick are invited to gather in the Church for a blessing. Some people use their visit to Knock to strengthen their relationship with God in the sacrament of Confession by talking to a priest etc. In the Shrine there are many places where people stop and light candles for their special intentions. I lit a candle for your intentions and placed it at the Shrine for you.
